

**THE FOREIGN EXCHANGE REGULATION
(AMENDMENT) ACT, 1956.***

**{Act No. XXXIII OF 1956.}
(The 5th October 1956)**

It is hereby enacted as follows : —

1. This Act may be called the Foreign Exchange Regulation (Amendment) Act, 1956.

2. In section 2 of the Foreign Exchange Regulation Act, 1947—

(i) the following *shall be inserted* as clause (a) thereof, namely:—

“(a) ‘currency’ includes all coins, currency notes, bank notes, postal orders, money orders, cheques drafts, traveller’s cheques, letters of credit, bills of exchange, and promissory notes;”

(ii) the existing clause (a) *shall be re-lettered* as clause (aa) thereof; and

(iii) for clause (c) the following *shall be substituted* as clause (c) thereof, namely:—

“(c) ‘foreign exchange’ includes foreign currency and all deposits, credits and balances in any foreign country or payable in any foreign currency, and any documents or instruments expressed or drawn in Myanmar currency but payable in any foreign currency;”
